ABOUT THE H & W WILLIAMS MEMORIAL TRUST

The Henry and William Williams Memorial Trust is a Charitable Trust. It was set up in 1904 by Archdeacon Samuel Williams to honour the memory of his father Henry and his uncle William, who were missionaries among the Māori people of Aotearoa New Zealand from 1823 - 1876. The Trustees of this Trust are all descendants of Henry and Marianne Williams, and/or William and Jane Williams.

The purpose of the Trust is to support Christian missionary work on Anglican principles among indigenous people in Aotearoa New Zealand, the Pacific Islands and other countries. The types of projects that the Trust is able to help with include:

- Supporting existing missions
- Establishing new missions
- Specific health, education, welfare and other projects within missions
- Education of suitable candidates for missionary work
- Anglican mission support

CONDITIONS OF APPLICATION

If you receive a grant or other funding from the H and W Williams Memorial Trust, you will agree to abide by the following conditions:

- You will use the money for the purpose for which it is intended.
- If the nature of your project changes, you will tell the Secretary of the Trust as soon as possible and you will explain why the changes are necessary.
- You will send a progress report to the Secretary of the Trust within 6 months of receiving the funding.
- You will provide an annual report to the Trust on the use of the funds for as long as you continue to receive funding from the Trust.
- You will provide a receipt to the Trust Secretary for any funds allocated to your organisation.
